# Bargains, bangers, bop til you drop

THERE will be no shortage of bargains on Sunday at what is billed as the World's Biggest Car Boot Sale.

The Hunter Life Education fund-raiser in the Energy Australia car park at Broadmeadow will benefit the organisation by a total of \$30,000.

Hunter Life Education's executive officer David Baker said there had been an unprecedented response from site-holders.

He said every available space had sold out earlier than ever before.

"This year we have 350 site-holders spread over 350 sites. They'll be coming from Sydney, the Mid-North Coast and across the Hunter," Mr Baker said.

"The car boot sale is a great way for a lot of people to make some extra money for Christmas. It's also a great place for shoppers to pick up a bargain."

The range of goods on sale this year will be extensive - everything from food to clothing, jewellery to furniture.

"There's too much to list, but among the bargains will be new camping gear, car audio equipment, a truckload of soft toys, vinyl record bags, doll houses and cubby-house furniture," Mr Baker said.

"There'll be lots to see and lots to do.

"We've got a number of community and corporate partnerships now in place, so this year's event will be the

best yet.

"The World's Biggest Barbecue will be there to feed those attending the sale.

"We'll have three food court areas.

"And to ensure that visitors can factor lunch into their outing, the sale will be continuing later than before.

"It all starts at 9am and runs through to 2pm."

An entertainment precinct has been added this year and a strong on-stage program has been organised.

Headliners will be popular Newcastle alternative rock band Vaudeville performing tracks from their self-titled debut album.

Vaudeville is one of the top two from more than 1700 registered bands to make

MTV's *Uncharted* final.

The winner will secure a slot on the 2009 Big Day Out tour and a record deal with BMG.

Also appearing on Sunday will be Stroud-based band Will b Brats.

With an average age of 15 years, the band play a mix of solid rock, rock 'n' roll and modern rock.

Talent and performance schools have also been allocated stage time and members of the Newcastle Knights will be available for a meet-and-greet.

"This year's car boot sale promises to be a lot of fun," Mr Baker said.
